PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE by Drew Powell, President, RSCC

A labor of love! That sums up the efforts of literally hundreds of dedicated people on both sides of the Atlantic, in our Sister City, Pinneberg, Germany and here in Rockville.

Have you ever thrown a party, or for that matter, planned a wedding? Multiply that by a thousand and that's what it's like to plan not one, but two grand celebrations held in two cities all in the same year. Of course, I'm referring to the 60th Anniversary of the Sister City relationship between Rockville and Pinneberg.

The planning begins years in advance with the two cities comparing calendars, where multiple busy people must agree on dates, when they are available...no easy task. If you're the "visiting city," a delegation must be formed and travel arrangements must be made for each of the delegates. That information must be passed on to the host city in order to pair delegates with host families...part of the people-to-people concept that President Eisenhower had in mind, when he envisioned the Sister City initiative in 1956. Gifts, speeches and goodwill must be packed along with other essentials.

If you're the "host city," large venues must be reserved years in advance. Contracts with multiple vendors, such as caterers and live entertainment must be negotiated for a large Gala Reception. More venues must be secured for a grand Welcome Reception and Farewell Party. Guests must be invited to multiple events. Diplomatic functions

involving locally elected officials must be arranged. Transportation needs for visiting dignitaries must be reserved and a plethora of host families need to be contacted and paired with inbound guests. Daily excursions, which explore local venues, as well as regional ones, must be arranged for dozens of guests over a period of nearly a week. And if you're especially ambitious, throw in a citywide celebration (Rockto*bier*fest), where your seventy-plus guests and hundreds, if not thousands of citizens can mix, mingle and enjoy craft beers and schnitzel together. More gifts, speeches and goodwill present themselves through the week.

There are hundreds of other details that both cities must engage in, not to mention advertising, commemorative documentation and a multitude of complex logistics. It's a team effort, which requires a high level of coordination, commitment, and yes, financial resources on the part of both cities.

Some may say, why go through all the trouble ... now that's there's FaceTime and Twitter?
But there's nothing like folks with different points of view, especially from different cultures and different parts of the world getting together and celebrating both our similarity and diversity. In the current environment of uncertainty, relationships such as the one Rockville has shared with Pinneberg for these sixty years mean more now than ever. It is the efforts of committed individuals toward this common goal of unity through respect and mutual cooperation that build the bridges, which bring people and nations together as friends.

Rockville - Pinneberg Celebrate 60th Anniversary as Sister Cities! - By Bob Wright, February 28, 2017

Do you know that the City of Rockville has a Sister City relationship with Pinneberg, Germany? Pinneberg is located in northern Germany, near the city of Hamburg... and here's how that relationship came to be.

In the early 1950's, **Dickran (Dick) and Viola (Vi) Hovsepian** had a problem with their water heater. They were told the part they need would come from Germany. This caused some consternation for the Hovsepians. In 1956, midway into Dickran Hovsepian's term as Mayor of Rockville, he found information about a new program President Eisenhower was trying to establish, and immediately thought of his previous involvement with "German technology."

The program was called the "People-to-People" program, administered by the U.S. State Department. It was a way to forge contacts with people of foreign nations (and most likely to capitalize on those bonds as deterrence against impending post-WWII Soviet intentions). After an extensive search by Rockville officials, and some haggling with the State Department, Rockville was paired with the city of Pinneberg, Germany, which is located in the northernmost state of Schleswig-Holstein. The decision was based on similarities of size, location, economies and populations at the time. When the dust finally settled, Mayor Hovsepian and the Rockville City Council made an official Resolution on October 13, 1957 to establish a Sister City relationship with Pinneberg. Mayor Hovsepian then made a trip to Pinneberg to present the Resolution to Pinneberg's Bürgermeister (Mayor) Henry Glissmann.

In May of 1958, Mayor Glissmann paid a return visit to Rockville, staying with Dick and Vi Hovsepian for over a week. Mayor Glissman attended many festivities designed to mark the occasion. From those two auspicious visits a city partnership was born. Although it waxed and waned over the next 30 years, with sporadic visits in both directions by

officials and residents of both cities, a reinvigoration of the process occurred in 1984. In the mid-1980s non-governmental (private) organizations were formed in both cities: the Rockville Sister City Corporation (RSCC) and the German-American Society, Rockville-Pinneberg (DAGRP). These two groups were established to augment their respective city governments' dedication to the tenets of the original resolution – that is, to maintain and grow a healthy international relationship on a people-to-people basis.

Since their formation, the RSCC and the DAGRP have been instrumental in initiating exchanges of every type: governmental, athletic, educational, artistic, cultural, and personal. The two cities even have streets named for their counterparts: "Pinneberg Avenue" is located in Rockville, and "Rockvillestraße" is found in Pinneberg.

In the past thirty years, the two cities have enthusiastically celebrated the 10-year anniversary years - 1987, 1997, etc. For the 30th anniversary year, in 1987, the entire Rockville Mayor and Council traveled to Pinneberg. Former Mayor **Steve VanGrack** was a member of that 1987 delegation, "I



found our visit to Pinneberg informative, festive and heart-warming. I have formed a number of lasting friendships with residents of Pinneberg. Over the years many of those friends stayed with me during their visits, both official and non-official, to Rockville."

The Rockville-Pinneberg relationship is now 60 years old, one of the longest in formal Sister City history. In October 2017. Rockville will host a delegation from Pinneberg. In June 2017 a delegation of Rockville officials and citizens will travel to Pinneberg for events and festivities celebrating the relationship. Mayor Bridget Donnell Newton heads the Rockville delegation, "I'm looking forward to our visit to Pinneberg in June and to hosting their delegation in October. I thank the RSCC and DAGRP for their diligence in maintaining this special relationship between our two cities through the years. Especially in this day and time - it is vital that we work together and celebrate the commonalities we share as people." Drew Powell, President of the Rockville Sister City Corporation, is also eagerly anticipating the two celebrations, "As we move forward to the June and October celebrations, we are reminded of the generational teamwork on both sides of the Atlantic, which makes our unique partnership so special. It is truly a labor of love on the part of the cities of Pinneberg and Rockville, our counterparts at the DAGRP, the RSCC Board of Directors and General Membership as well as the citizens of both municipalities. Together, we are building bridges of hope and mutual understanding."
